Background of the study

- Contemporary extrinsic forces significantly impact tourists' travel behaviour, especially in long-haul destinations (Aldao et al., 2021; Mkono, 2019).
- The importance of international tourist arrivals for emerging markets such as South Africa cannot be overstated; hence considering and pre-empting the susceptibility of international long-haul tourism to global events and shocks is critical.
- Germany is a top global tourism source market with a discernable significance in the development, sustainable growth and, more pertinently, the resilience and recovery of international tourism (World Tourism Organization UNWTO, 2021).
- Profiling and better understanding the long-haul travel behaviour amid unfolding crises and 'glocal' shocks are antecedents to embedding long-term inclusivity, sustainability and resilience in tourism (Aldao et al., 2022; Miao et al., 2021; Ramires et al., 2022).
- Despite these considerations, the potential paradigm shifts in the long-haul travel behaviour of tourists due to the effect of the COVID-19 pandemic, the war in Ukraine and the subsequent financial, food and energy crises, as well as subjective preferences associated with climate change remain generally unknown and requires urgent empirical inquiry (Aldao et al., 2022; Miao et al., 2021; Mkono, 2019; Senbeto & Hon, 2020; Yang et al., 2022).

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Objectives of the study



- Establishing a better understanding of German tourist's demand dynamics toward long-distance international travel within the context of significant extrinsic forces
- Profiling Germans concerning their perceptions of South Africa as a tourism destination country
- Determining the potential impact of cognitive (country image, attitude, subjective norms, perceived behavioural control) dimensions on the long-distance travel intentions of German tourists
- Exploring the potential role of German tourists' affective (emotions, travel desire) behaviour in tourism decision-making when considering long-distance travel to South Africa
- Examining whether the expected high relevance of extrinsic influences can be confirmed and whether there are differences in certain groups (including age and income groups)

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









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Sample characteristics *Place of Residence (Federal State)*








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Long-distance trips during Covid-19 times (since March 2020)



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







Results: Anticipated positive emotions with regard to travelling to South Africa












Risk Type










Sample characteristics Household net income




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Bivariate Results: Long-distance travel behaviour <u>during Covid-19 times</u> / age groups



Long-distance trips during Covid-19 times (since March 2020)*






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Bivariate Results: Long-distance travel behaviour <u>during Covid-19 times</u> / income groups




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Bivariate Results: Long-distance travel behaviour <u>before Covid-19 times</u> / income groups






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Bivariate Results: Long-distance travel behaviour <u>during Covid-19 times</u> / level of education



Long-distance trips before the pandemic (before 2020)*











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













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








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Bivariate results: Intrinsic travel motives long-distance trips / importance of ecological sustainability II




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Bivariate results: Intrinsic travel motives long-distance trips / importance of ecological sustainability III

- Germans who do not rule out or plan to travel abroad in the next three years have extensive experience with long-distance travel and more than half are seriously considering a long-distance trip in the next three years.
- When asked whether the desire to go on a long-distance trip is greater than it was three years ago i.e. in the "pre-crises period" the picture is divided: about 40% agree that the desire is greater (top-2 values), but about the same number also disagrees with the corresponding statements (low-2 values). This already indicates that the multiple crises can lead to very different psychological reactions.
- Core travel motives for going on long-distance trips are experiencing nature and gaining new impressions (72% each) as well as relaxation (68%), wellbeing and escape from everyday life (64% each).
- The youngest age group (18-29 years) shows the greatest interest in long-distance travel across all questions the 60-74 age group the least. Furthermore, it is evident that people with a medium level of education and a medium to high income are particularly interested in long-distance travel in the next three years.







- The evaluation of the results according to risk type and importance of ecological sustainability is also interesting:
 - Risk-affine respondents show a significantly higher affinity for long-distance travel both in terms of past travel and plans for the next three years.
 - People who state that it is important to them to keep their carbon footprint low when travelling do not perceive distant destinations less positive than those who care less about their environmental impact. In contrary, they even feel slightly more excited about visiting distant destinations than the average respondent. Also with regard to their long-distance travel behaviour in the past and interest in the future there are no significant differences between the high-importance group and people for whom the eco-balance is less important. This illustrates the large attitude behaviour gap on the topic of sustainable travel.
- A preliminary evaluation of the results regarding the perception of South Africa as a travel destination shows the majority of the respondents has a generally positive attitude towards South Africa as a tourism destination expressing interest and delight at the prospect of potentially experiencing travel and tourism to the country.







- The support of a trip to South Africa by their reference groups (social norms) is seen more critically agreements (top-2-values) range between 26 and 46%. However, this aspect appears not to influence their decision-making or perceptions towards South Africa too much.
- However, a central key to tourists' decision-making is the perceived ability of tourists to actually perform the action in this case to travel to South Africa (perceived behavioural control). As such, among others access information that will aid in their taking the necessary pre-travel health precautions and their ability to manage crises and travel despite the current multiple crises are critical:
 - Regarding health issues (particularly Covid-19), the majority of the respondents feels rather secure to get all the necessary information. Hence, this does not seem to be a big obstacle for travelling to South Africa anymore.
 - However, only one third of the respondents agrees to be able to afford such a trip during the ongoing war in the Ukraine and the increased energy costs.
 - Intriguingly, up to half the surveyed respondents indicated that they were worried about crime in South Africa and is also aware that their carbon footprint can not be kept low when travelling to South Africa. These aspects might become critical in a real travel decision-making situation.







- South Africa's value proposition as a country is primarily based on its natural landscape and wildlife offerings which is also reflected in its image as a travel destination with very high agreements on all statements related to national parks and nature.
- Respondents indicating that they would seriously consider travelling to the country within the next three years would primarily travel with their partners (53%) or their families, including children (22%).
- Thus, is a generally positive perception amongst Germans of South Africa as a tourism destination and despite some obvious challenges, such as crime, the war in Ukraine and the subsequent public resource impact of long-distance travel to the country.



Next steps: further multivariate analyses

Further advanced analyses will include:

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- Exploring the influence of distance perception, positive and negative emotions, as well as South Africa's image on German citizen's long-haul travel behaviour towards South Africa
- Model the influence of long-haul travel desire, travel recency and travel frequency on German citizen's travel intentions
- Explore the effect of German's planned behaviour (attitude, subjective norms, perceived behavioural control) on decisionmaking, focusing on the impact of contemporary aspects such as the energy and financial crises in Europe, and the perceived climate impact [the carbon footprint] of long-haul travel to a destination such as South Africa
- Develop a segmented profile of Germans based on their socio-demographics to better understand German citizens as potential long-haul travellers based on their attitudes, perceptions towards long-haul travel, sustainable tourism, as well as perceptions towards South Africa.







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
